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Helping A Young Man To Be Great!

I was scrolling through YouTube shorts the other day and I came across this hilarious familiar scene unfold: a young engrossed in his computer, and a girl enters the frame with an exasperated face. Obviously annoyed, she asks, "why are you guys always gaming?" to which the man retorts with uninterested sarcasm, "The same reason you put makeup on every day!" "And why is that?" she asks. His answer, simple yet profound, reverberates with a touch of candor, "To escape reality!" In that fleeting moment, her expression morphs into a portrait of genuine, helpless irritation, silent acknowledgment of the truth embedded in his words, plain for all to see.

I've never been, what they call nowadays, a gamer, when I was younger – but I had my moments, probably just like many of your boys right now. And you might also be wondering how come these boys spend so much time playing with these gadgets.

It might be true, yes, that perhaps in those moments, they wished to escape reality. And definitely it's frustrating to see one's child waste so much time in these senseless competitive games and sacrificing their study period for the sake of entertainment.

But I think it's a lot more than that. Inside a man's soul, there seems to exist that constant echo of longing to be challenged, to "flex", to belong, to feel confident, especially in front of their peers. Those are the very same reasons why, for instance, boys interested in sports, or why they want to show off, sometimes wanting to act mature, doing grownup things, both positive unfortunately negative and aspects of being a grownup.

Looking at it in a more optimistic manner, I believe that behind all these, one could find the innate desire of Man to be great, because that's what he was made for – Greatness. It's just that at this stage in their lives, and perhaps in our lives too, the idea of greatness still has to undergo a lot of chiseling. Parents are protagonists in this process of chiseling the idea their kids have of greatness: presenting them high ideals, encouraging them to

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dream big, leading them towards realities you consider valuable, presenting them your lives as virtuous attractive and lives worthy of imitation, setting the goal high according to your principles. Because a man who is mediocre is an unattractive man. So many times, our world today convince us mediocrity is what is fashionable. Casually you would hear expressions like "why complicate your life?" or "you don't have to go through all that," somehow giving the impression that life is better and happiness is achieved when life is easy and devoid of suffering; that we don't have to strive SO hard to attain contentment in this world. Take it easy, in other words.

There is this scene in the Apple TV documentary on Stephen Curry that goes in contrast with this sentiment. Early on in his life he fell in love with Basketball and ended up really playing well in school. But he had a little disadvantage, he was small and was not growing as fast as his peers did. When he was in sophomore year, he told his dad, you know what I want to play college basketball. His dad warned him that he had got to go through a lot if he's serious in pursuing that level. And the first one he had to change was the way he shoots. He was skinny and but areat shooter. small а However, his stature made him develop a habit of shooting the



ball from his waist instead of shooting from the head. something you could get away with when you're in high school, but college is different. His dad proposed to him to spend the whole summer changing this habit. At first, he was all-in for the idea until he actually started shooting for hours, every single day. "And soon enough", the mom narrated, "Steph started grumbling, I don't wanna do this, why do I have to do this, I can't keep going... And I said to him, you always have a choice, son. If this is too frustrating for you and you don't feel that it's valuable, stop now, go back to how you've been shooting, and let's move on with this thing. But if you are really buying into what your dad is prescribing for you, keep going."

It is one thing to aspire for greatness, but it is another thing to actually have the fortitude to persevere, no matter what, in attaining that greatness. Children are capable of dreaming about great things, but they need grownups to show them the way to get there. Help your kids cultivate this desire for greatness and encourage them to embrace challenges as opportunities to build strength. Walk with them steadfastly, guiding them along this journey.

And what is this greatness we are referring to? How is it defined, how is this quantified, how is this manifested? There are so many ways of interpreting greatness in one's life. But I'll focus on one.

think When about man's inherent longing for greatness, what comes to mind is the story of the rich young man in the Gospels. Sts. Matthew and Mark tell us about a young man who ran up to Jesus, knelt down before him and asked him, "Good teacher, what must I do to inherit eternal life?" Jesus tells him, "You know the commandments..." The young man proudly confirms to Him that he has been observing them and asks Him what else can he do? At that moment, Jesus looked at him with love and invited him to be perfect by selling everything he had and give it to the poor and follow Him. When the young man heard this, he went away sad, for he had many possessions.

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times, one discovers profound wisdom hidden in the sadness of this young man and how it speaks to all of us in our pursuit of greatness. The sadness of this rich young man was not so much caused by the fact that he had great possessions (wealth, power, popularity... realities one would easily count as indicators of greatness) and that Jesus invited him to give them all up. His sadness springs from the fact that he couldn't let go of the little that he had while his heart for something much longed greater, that is eternal life, God Himself. To be perfect, as it is indicated in our Lord's words addressed to the rich man, is not so much about detaching oneself riches. That is just prerequisite what comes to afterwards, namely to come and follow Jesus - to be with Him and to be filled up by Him.

Pope Benedict XVI explains this graphically in Spes Salvi when he wrote.

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"Man was created for greatnessfor God himself; he was created to be filled by God. But his heart is too small for the greatness to which it is destined. It must be stretched..." For Christians. greatness not something is vague or abstract. It is not just quantified by material realities like success or possessions or fame. It is not even just about being good or doing good things. Greatness is to be filled by God, to be filled by his dreams for us, to live by the life he has prepared for us to enjoy. To be great means none other than to fulfill what we already are according to the dignity God has given us from the beginning. And this truth has always been here, written in our hearts since the very creation of Man - we were fashioned after image, after his God's own likeness. We were made like Gods, even before the very temptation of the serpent using the exact same words.

But our hearts have been restricted, limited by our own self-absorption, by our sinfulness, and narrowmindedness.

That is why it must be stretched through humility, together with all the other virtues you and I are invited acquire. to Parents, teachers, formators have this responsibility to widen the horizon of those entrusted to them by God children, students, mentees. It is our vocation to make them realize that they are capable of greatness advantage of their innate longing for great things even in the most human and ordinary circumstances of their youth. Probably it begins with that longing to be challenged, to show off, to feel that competitiveness in computer games which they waste their time. And from there, little by little, we can lead them by the hand acquiring that capacity to fill themselves not only by their little ideas of greatness but by God's greatness.




